First Winter Ice Storm Hits the Flint Hills

The Flint Hills RECA's service area was hit by a heavy ice storm that produced power outages for many members in nine counties.

The storm started on Friday, November 27 with heavy rain that quickly turned into heavy ice. By November 28, the power lines and trees were covered in ice and causing major problems.

By Sunday morning, we needed assistance to repair the continuing line damage that the trees and ice had caused. Mutual Aid crews from Caney Valley Electric, Lyon-Coffey Electric, Radiant Electric, Rolling Hills Electric, and Twin Valley Electric came to offer their help with a total of 19 linemen and their trucks ready to go.

On Monday, November 30, we still had 630 meters without power. That afternoon the sun came out, the temperature rose and the ice started to melt fast. When the ice started melting and dropping from the power lines, they started to bounce. This caused problems with lines making contact with each other, which blew fuses, caused arcing, and many lines down. These problems also affected our power supplier, Westar, which caused them to lose power at mul-

tiple Flint Hills RECA substations.

All of these issues resulted in more outages and by late Monday afternoon we had around 1,665 meters without power. With the help of our surrounding electric cooperatives and our own dedicated linemen, we were able to reconnect all residential meters by late Tuesday night.

Flint Hills RECA would like to, say a big "thank you" to the office staff who answered phones and radios and guided crews to the damaged areas. Not to mention our 15 linemen from the Council Grove and Hillsboro

warehouses, as well as the 19 linemen from the five other cooperatives for their outstanding dedication and tireless determination while working in the freezing rain to make sure Flint Hills RECA members had power.

5 Steps to Sealing Air Leaks

Did you know heating and cooling accounts for roughly half of your home's energy use? Caulking cracks and gaps around windows, doors and spaces around wires (telephone, electrical, cable and gas lines), water spigots and dryer vents can pay off with big energy savings. The updates may cost between \$5 and \$30, but they will result in energy savings of approximately 5 to 10 percent.

For the project, you will need the following materials: **caulk, caulking gun, knife or tool to cut, rags, and water.**

1 Prep – Clean the area where you will be applying the caulk. Remove any dirt, loose paint or old, cracked caulk. Be sure the area is dry before applying new caulk appropriate for your application.

2 Load – You will need to pull the plunger all the way back to load the tube of caulk into the barrel of the caulking gun. Next, squeeze the trigger a few times until the plunger makes contact with the tube. Squeeze once or twice more to fill the tip with caulk.

3 Apply – To figure out the right amount of caulk needed, experiment with an out-of-the-way section. You may find that you need less caulk than you thought. Hold the caulking gun at a slight angle. Apply steady pressure on the trigger to create a solid stream from the tip, which should be placed 1/2 inch or less from the intended destination of the material. Use just enough caulk to do the job. Use your finger to gently press the caulk into the corner, crack or space.

4 Release – Once the trigger is fully depressed, allow it to spring back and depress it again. Keep the gun moving while caulk is still coming out of the tip.

5 Clean – Use a damp cloth or rag to clean off most of the excess caulk. Use a dry cloth to clean off the rest.
